hand accounts of the people and the entrepreneurial spirits that came before us. **Let's see how many sites and/or cities you know:**



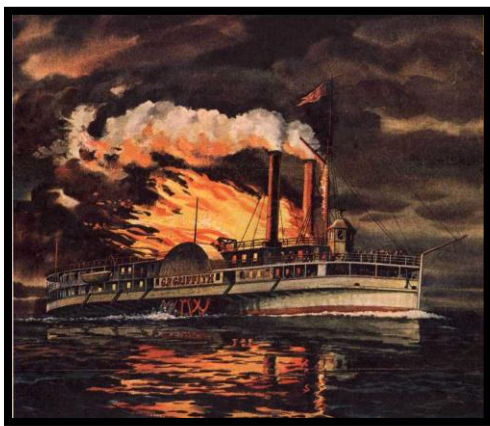
